ifteen-year-old Libby looked around at the rubble as tears welled in her eyes. She couldn't believe that the pile of wood, broken glass and trash used to be her home. Her whole town of Joplin, Missouri had been torn apart

by a tornado - so much so that it was hard for her family to find the block they lived on. Luckily, her whole family was safe, but the tornado killed over 100 people in her town, and changed Libby's life forever.

"I was having lunch with my mom and brothers at my grandma's house when we heard sirens in the distance," Libby tells TWIST. Her grandfather and uncle were at her house across town when the tornado started. "We tried to call

them, but the phone lines went completely dead," Libby remembers. She was paralyzed with fear that she'd never hear from them again, but all she could do was huddle with her mom and brothers, and wait anxiously for it to end.

though Libby lost all her belongings, she feels lucky her family is safe. Now, she's living with her grandparents and taking it one day at a time. "I just hope to see the town rebuilt," she says.
